*From the Interim Pastor*

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Most people I know don't look forward to Lent. Childhood memories are mostly to blame. I grew up in a family where "giving up" something for Lent was an expectation, not a choice. A few days before Ash Wednesday, the dinner conversation revolved around one question: "What are you giving up for Lent?" I sacrificed the usual suspects of candy, chips, ice cream, even TV. Each year I wondered what this had to do with Jesus. Lent was a dark and somber time. Hymns were almost all penitential and mournful. Words like "sacrifice," "discipline," and "self-denial" were often used in ways that suggested that Lent was something to be endured rather than a time of grace and spiritual growth.

Through the years I now see Lent as a yearly second chance. Each year the Church gives us six weeks to take a long, loving look at our lives to see if our values and priorities are in line with God's desires for us. Since all of us have "fallen short of the glory of God," Lent becomes the second chance, or do-over to "return to God with our whole heart."

I invite you during this Lenten season to ask yourself . . . "What is the meaning of my life?" "How can I grow deeper in my relationship with God?" "What is preventing me from being the person God created me to be?" "How can I love others (especially those for whom it is difficult to love) as I have been loved by God?"

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, February 10. We will hear again the words, "Remember you are dust, and to dust you shall return." The imposition of ashes feels like an imposition, a humbling reminder of our limits and finitude as human beings. But it is also an invitation to embark on a journey of second chances and do-overs which lead us from death to new life in Christ.

### **Ash Wednesday – February 10**

"Broken Hearts Restored" ♦ Joel 2:12-14  
Our hearts are broken in sorrow over sin;  
Christ restores our hearts through his forgiveness.

### **Week 1 – February 17**

"Broken Bread Restored" ♦ John 6:48-58  
Bread is broken at the Last Supper;  
we are restored through the Bread of Life, Jesus.

### **Week 2 – February 24**

"Broken Justice Restored" ♦ 2 Corinthians 5:20-21  
A broken justice system put Jesus in the cross;  
we are restored when by his death we are declared not guilty.

### **Week 3 – March 2**

"Broken Promises Restored" ♦ Matthew 26:69-75  
Peter's broken promises to never deny Jesus are restored by the surpassing love of Christ.

### **Week 4 – March 9**

"Broken Trust Restored" ♦ Matthew 26:14-25  
Judas breaks his trust with Jesus by betraying him;  
Our broken trust is restored through the sacrifice of Christ.

### **Week 5 – March 16**

"Broken Vessel Restored" ♦ Mark 14:1-9  
A broken vessel holds costly perfume;  
We are broken vessels restored when Christ pays the price for us on the cross.

## **THE JOURNEY OF LENT**

Lent is a season of forty days often imagined as a journey echoing the forty-day journey of Noah and his family in the flood, the forty-year journey of the Israelites in the wilderness, the forty days Elijah spent before hearing the still, small voice of God, and the forty-day journey of Jesus in the desert. Traditionally Lent was a season when the church focused on preparation of baptismal candidates and the continued process of conversion.

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, February 10, with a service of Holy Communion at 7:30 pm. Ash Wednesday receives its name for the practice of having ashes “imposed” in the form of a cross. Using ashes as a sign of repentance is an ancient practice often mentioned in the Bible. The early Christians adopted the use of ashes symbolizing several aspects of our human experience. First, ashes remind us of God’s judgment, as God said to Adam, “Dust you are and to dust you shall return” (Genesis 3:19). Second, ashes remind us of the shortness of life, for one day the words “We commit his/her body to the ground; earth to earth, ashes to ashes, dust to dust” will be said over our bodies. Third, ashes are a symbol of repentance, as expressed in Luke 10:13 and in the hymn “Savior, When in Dust to Thee”. On Ash Wednesday we gather to begin our Lenten journey. The imposition of ashes will be offered during the service.

## **LENTEN DEVOTIONAL** **WE ARE CALLED, WE ARE CHOSEN**

We make choices every day - plenty of them. Our lives are really a set of choices, from what we are going to wear and eat to how we will treat others. By his words and by his example, Jesus has plenty to teach us about how to make the most important choices in our relationships with others. Lent is a good time for us to set aside some time to reflect on our choices together in light of Jesus’ words.

Jesus’ message is not just about believing that God has a deep love for each of us. His message is also about how to *live and to act*. He called himself the Way. As we listen to what Jesus says and watch what he does, we see that following him isn’t easy because it will lead us to the cross. But living and acting in the truth of God’s deep love for all of us will also lead us to the new life of Easter.

This devotional We Are Called, We Are chosen, provides an opportunity to think and to pray about our choices and why we make them. Each day includes a brief Scripture passage, a reflection, and a prayer. May our experience of Lent deepen so that we will rejoice all the more fully at Jesus’ triumph over death on Easter Sunday.

## **LENTEN AWAKENINGS**

Lenten Awakenings, a Conference-wide event will take place here at St. Luke’s for 4 Saturday mornings on February 13, 20, 27 and March 5 from 9:30 - 11:00am. Too Busy Not To Pray: Slowing Down To Be With God by Bill Hybels will be the discussion book this year. This book calls us to make prayer a priority in our lives and empowers us to participate in God’s work in the world. The fee of \$20.00 includes all four sessions, the book and leadership materials. There is no pre-registration. Bring your \$20.00 fee to the first session. If you want to pick up your book before the first session,


## **“PACKING UP” CHRISTMAS**

## **SCOUT SUNDAY**

Scout Sunday will be held at St. Luke’s on February 14. During the service we will recognize the contributions of young people and adults to scouting. Scouts from Troop 113 will serve as greeters, ushers, readers and intercessors.

Boy Scout Troop 113 is a boy-led troop and has been meeting at St. Luke’s since 1934. It is an active program of weekly meetings and monthly outings. These activities and events include camping trips, week long summer boy scout camp, Philmont adventure camping, whitewater rafting, backpacking, canoeing, biking and rock climbing just to name a few. They are involved in several community service events such as the annual Thanksgiving Food Drive, Water Works Community Park Easter Egg Hunt, the Memorial Day parade, Martin Luther King Day of Service, Trappe Days, and often other events depending on what a scout is doing for his Eagle Project.

There are currently 35 scouts in the Troop. As of this month, Troop 113 is proud that 67 scouts have earned the prestigious rank of Eagle. The troop is extremely grateful to St. Luke’s for meeting space in Moyer Hall.

## **SUNDAY SCHOOL**

In January the Sunday School students, led by Sue Gregory, learned about missionaries. In particular they heard about Martha Mensendieck (the missionary St. Luke’s supports) and her life in Japan. 
