

Stewardship: Living our Gifts

Christ has no body on earth but ours, no hands but ours, no feet but ours. Ours are the eyes through which the compassion of Christ looks upon the world, ours are the feet with which he goes about doing good, ours are the hands with which he blesses his people.

One definition of a Christian Steward” says: “A Good Christian Steward receives God’s gifts graciously, nurtures them responsibly, and shares them in love.” So often, we have heard that “Stewardship” involves offering our time, talents and treasure to God, God’s People, and the church. But what does that really mean and how can we transform the words into actions?

“Treasure” The church has a cost of living, just as your family does. There are bills to pay, events that require funding and missions that we support that all require our financial support. We are encouraged to make consistent gifts to the offering in thanksgiving for the gifts God has given to us.

Consider offering your treasure by prayerfully reflecting on the gifts God has giving you and sharing those financial gifts regularly with the church, so collectively we can strive to make a difference in God’s world.

“Time” We all have busy schedules, but using our time to regularly communicate with God is a big part of being a good Christian Steward. How will we know what to do if we aren’t listening to Him for guidance? Spending time with God in prayer is the beginning of stewardship. When we spend time with God in prayer, we are spiritually preparing ourselves to serve the church and others. Consider offering your time by: Attending church every Sunday; inviting a friend or acquaintance to church; praying together with your family; taking time to discuss the faith with your family; reading the Bible every day; spending time with God in personal prayer and the individuals listed in the prayer chain.

“Talent” God has given each of you special gifts and talents. Each and every person has been created and gifted in a unique and completely individual manner. God created you with these spiritual gifts for your benefit and for the benefit of others. You and only you can offer the gifts you have been given to this world. **Consider** offering your talents by joining committees, and participating in projects and services within the church and your community.

Stewardship Prayer: Holy Spirit guide me as I discern the gifts I have been given and help me to offer them back without reservation to God. Clear my life of all distractions so that I may respond to His call. Come Holy Spirit to instill in me a burning desire to share my unique gifts. Amen

A Word About Worship: All Saints’ Day

Pope Boniface IV formally started All Saints’ Day on May 13 in 609 AD when he dedicated the Pantheon in Rome. The current date of November 1 was established by Pope Gregory III during his reign (731-741 AD) when he dedicated a chapel in Rome’s St. Peter’s Basilica in honor of all saints. While this celebration was originally limited to Rome, later in 837 Pope Gregory IV ordered the official observance of All Saints’ Day every November 1 and extended its celebration to all churches.

More recently, All Saints’ Day recognizes those whose sainthood is known only to God. Sainthood isn’t given by a group of religious leaders. It’s granted by God, Himself, to any common, salt-of-the-earth person who simply trusts Christ and is a follower of Jesus. God calls a saint; anyone who trusts in Christ alone for salvation: 1 Corinthians 1:2.

The Christian festival of All Saints’ Day now comes from the understanding that there is a powerful spiritual connection between those in Heaven and on Earth. All Saints has come to mean literally ALL saints. The 1662 Book of Common Prayer says that the holiday stands for “the unity of Christians of all ages, countries, and races in Christ, and the perfection of that unity in heaven.

As Rev. Dr. John Shetler said once, “Do you really think that those people in your life that loved and prayed for you while they were on earth don’t continue to do so from heaven?” We are all connected. On November 5, St. Luke’s will celebrate our service of remembrance of those who have joined with God and other saints in heaven. During that time, we will honor our church’s saints, and remember our connectedness to our own past saints and find inspiration in their stories of God’s faithfulness.
