

PASTORS LETTER

Hopefully, the month of April finds us enjoying the changing seasons, leaving winter's darker and colder atmosphere behind in exchange for warmer temperatures and the first heartwarming signs of new life captured in budding trees and flowers, gentle breezes, and baby animals being born. For many of us, it is a time of changed outlook as well, as we tend to feel restored, our hearts and minds lighter in anticipation of getting outdoors once again to do whatever it is we do – gardening, recreation, sitting on the porch with a cup of coffee...

This year, April will also find us in the midst of the changing liturgical seasons. Having spent all of March immersed in the season of Lent, we now find ourselves fast approaching Palm Sunday, the beginning of Holy Week and the events leading to the Passion of our Lord. Holy Week begins with the celebratory drama of Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem amid shouts of "Hosanna" on Palm Sunday, but ironically, we also know that the crowd's cries of "Hosanna!" will soon change to "Crucify him!" On Maundy Thursday, the church commemorates Jesus' last evening with his disciples as three key events take place – his washing of the disciples' feet, the institution of the Lord's Supper, and his new commandment "to love one another." The name, Maundy Thursday, derives from the Latin, *mandatum novum*, referring to the "new commandment" that Jesus taught his disciples. Good Friday, of course marks the crucifixion of Jesus – his painful suffering and death on a cross for our sakes, and together, we pay special attention to the deepening shadows as we remember the events surrounding his death.

Each of the events of Holy Week helps us to experience the transition from the somber observances and disciplines of Lent, to the joyous celebration of Easter Day, when the hopes and expectations of Christians everywhere are realized in the resurrection of Jesus Christ. But our journey doesn't end here. The joy of Easter, and the good news that it brings, cannot be limited to a single day's celebration. The season that follows Easter Day is a time for extended celebration and joyful Christian living as we share God's love and care with others, reaching beyond our comfort zones to minister to all, as Jesus, himself, ministered to all. Easter is indeed a season that moves us from death to new life, a season that celebrates: "Alleluia! Christ is Risen!" – a season when we joyfully proclaim that we are Easter people!

TUESDAY MORNING BIBLE STUDY




