REV. JOHN'S MUSINGS.

Council has blessed us twice in recent two months of conversations to proceed with two critical aspects of our church life. One is the fall festival. Yes, this is a monumental day – we have never taken upon ourselves to undergo a major event, but it will be a great day with food trucks, crafters selling their items by renting a table from us, having our country store for baked items and/or canned goods to sell. This will be a fund-raiser geared to St. Luke's but more importantly, to make St. Luke's visible in our community. One of our main goals is to make our name become very visible. It is my prayer with this extra visibility, we will attract people into our doors and we can invite them to church. I will be ambassador at large talking with people. This is also a time in which we rub shoulder to shoulder with each of you working together to make this event successful. We will really get to know each other well after the day is over. The live auction that begins at 3:00pm. At some point, we will bid on throwing a pie into my face; the highest bidder will win the honor and this will surely be a spectacle.

Secondly, Council voted to proceed with St. Luke's undergoing a revitalization with Agile Church, a mainline church that was on the fold of collapsing and turned around numerically and spiritually. We will learn from the church specialist over several Saturdays which will span into next spring. The church specialist is Mike Piazza, who will study our church by-laws, our functions, worship patterns along with suggestions, then at the end of Spring turn these into real suggestions. In turn, Piazza will offer our spiritual DNA suggestions since each church is unique and has it's own cultural norms. On top of this effort, Piazza will offer coaching for over a year after the training is over. Coaching is critical so we do not lose our momentum and focus. Meanwhile, we need ten people who are committed to this process. I will be praying over these ten people who want St. Luke's to thrive well ahead in the next 50 years. Please keep this team in your prayers and those who are committed to this endeavor.


