CHRISTMAS BABY

Have you given much thought to the concept of a baby's being the mode in which the very presence of God would be manifested in this world? Think about it: a baby – a helpless, powerless, weak, vulnerable, defenseless baby.

I love babies; I always have. I am glad that I was born into a family with lots of children who wanted to have lots of children. There was never a lack of babies in our family, babies that needed to be held and cuddled and rocked to sleep. Holidays were always special because of babies. The conversations centered around them were always the same: "Look how much he/she has grown!" "Is he/she walking yet?" "He's going to be as big as his father!"

The Savior of this world was once a baby - a helpless, powerless, weak, vulnerable, defenseless baby; a baby who fed at the breast of his dear mother; a baby who needed to be cuddled and rocked to sleep; a baby whose diaper needed to be changed; a baby who got sick, who cried, who cooed, who made other people like me smile when they looked into his beautiful eyes. This was our Jesus.

A Word About Worship

What is Advent?

Advent Season is a very special time of year that sometimes gets lost in the bright lights of the Christmas season it precedes. The word *advent* comes from the Latin term *adventus* meaning "arrival" or "coming," Originally, however, it was not the coming of the Christ Child that was anticipated, but the Second Coming of Christ.

Sometimes, these days in the secular world, Advent season has mostly become a time of joy-filled, anticipation of Christmas: A time to prolong the season. In the Christian world, it should also be a time of annual preparation for the second coming of Christ.

The Advent season invites us to step away from what can be a frenzied time of decorating, parties, cooking, and shopping to consider how we commemorate the birth of Jesus, one of the holiest times in Christian faith. It is also a time to re-commit and re-evaluate how our lives reflect the readiness of Christ's next arrival.

The parament color of the Advent Season is blue or purple: The color that is also used during the Lente Season. These colors represent penance, sacrifice and preparation.

Advent is a time for faith communities and families to remember, through prayer, reflections, special music, and good deeds what the true meaning of Jesus' birth. Christians can use this time to quiet the deafening noise of the worldly commercialized Christmas and take time to listen for the quiet voice of the baby Jesus. While preparing for everything else, we can prepare ourselves for His next coming by rededicating ourselves for His service.
