PASTORS MESSAGE

The second chapter of Matthew tells the story of the magi who travelled from the east toward Jerusalem and ultimately Bethlehem after witnessing the appearance of a star that they knew to be a proclamation of the arrival of the Messiah. We know that the star went on before them and came to rest over the very spot where the infant Jesus could be found. That incredible star that they followed for so many miles, indeed, had led them to both the place and the moment where they could encounter the Son of God. They knew that their journey had been worth it as they worshipped him and offered gifts of great value.

A Word About Worship

What is Advent?

Advent Season is a very special time of year that sometimes gets lost in the bright lights of the Christmas season it precedes. The word *advent* comes from the Latin term *adventus* meaning "arrival" or "coming," Originally, however, it was not the coming of the Christ Child that was anticipated, but the Second Coming of Christ.

Sometimes, these days in the secular world, Advent season has mostly become a time of joy-filled, anticipation Christmas: A time to prolong the season. In the Christian world, it should also be a time of annual preparation for the second coming of Christ.

The Advent season invites us to step away from what can be a frenzied time of parties and shopping to consider how we commemorate the birth of Jesus, one of the holiest times in Christian faith. It is also a time to re-commit and re-evaluate how our lives reflect the readiness of Christ's next arrival.

The parament color of the Advent Season is blue or purple the color that is also used during the Lenten Season. These colors represent penance, sacrifice and preparation.

Advent is a time for faith communities and families to remember, through prayer, reflections, special music, and good deeds what the true meaning of Jesus' birth. Christians can use this time to quiet the deafening noise of the worldly commercialized Christmas and take time to listen for the baby Jesus. We can prepare ourselves for His coming by rededicating ourselves for His service.


