February is Blanket & Tools Month at St. Luke's. We will be accepting donations all month long for Church World Service (CWS) and their global emergency disaster preparedness programs. Just \$10 buys a warm blanket; \$50 provides for an entire family. Maybe a blanket is needed by a woman facing homelessness, evicted after falling behind in rent due to pandemic-related unemployment. Or a married couple whose home has been damaged by a hurricane, flood or tornado. Perhaps a whole family that lost everything in a fire. As you can well imagine, folks also need clean-up buckets, hygiene kits and basic tools to re-build their lives at such times. In 2019, congregational gifts provided over 118,000 CWS blankets and kits.
