REV. JOHN'S MUSINGS.

As most of you know I am a history buff. Did you know some interesting facts of George Washington? He was lucky but his coat wasn't. In the Braddock disaster of 1755, (not far from Uniontown PA), Washington's troops were caught in the crossfire between British and Native American soldiers. Two horses were shot from under Washington, and his coat was <u>pierced</u> by four musket balls, none of which hit his actual body. Did you know he lost more battles than he won? According to Joseph J. Ellis's <u>His Excellency: George Washington</u>, our first president "lost more battles than any victorious general in modern history." Poor George had some cash flow problems. Washington actually had to <u>borrow money</u> to attend his own first inauguration. HE WAS ONE OF THE SICKLIEST PRESIDENTS IN U.S. HISTORY. Throughout his life Washington <u>suffered</u> from a laundry list of ailments: diphtheria, tuberculosis, smallpox, dysentery, malaria, quinsy (tonsillitis), carbuncle, pneumonia, and epiglottitis—to name a few. On the day he died, Washington was treated with four rounds of bloodletting, which removed 5 pints of blood from his body. It seems that it proved to be too much. Join us on July 1 as I will bring President George Washington to life as First person sermon in 18th century attire, as I reveal his spiritual and religious life along with his role in America. IDEAS FOR OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD SHOEBOXES

Health & Beauty: Toothbrush, dental floss, band-aids, wipes, soap, comb/brush, manicure set, headbands, washcloth/towels. New clothes: Gloves/mittens, scarf, flip flops, socks, underwear, shoes, ball cap, sunglasses, pants, shirt. School Supplies: Pencils w/sharpener, pens, ruler, scissors, stickers, colored pencils, crayons, coloring books, sticky notes, stamp w/ink, small note pad, glue sticks, tape, water color set, markers, highlighters, journal/notebook, index cards, small picture books - young child. Toys: Dolls, tops, jacks, soccer ball w/ manual inflatable pump, toy binoculars, small dry erase board w/markers, play dough, whistles, kazoo, small stuffed animals, balls (bounce/tennis) finger puppets, silly putty, matchbox cars, fishing kit, puzzles, miniature chess/checkers, slinky, yo-yo, small Frisbee, kaleidoscope, toy truck/boat, small musical item - harmonica or records. Miscellaneous: Purse, wallet, compass water bottle, solar flashlights, drawstring backpacks, travel sewing kits, folding umbrella, friendship bracelets, tape measure, gardening trowel/gloves, silly curly straws, sippy cups/lids.

<u>DO NOT SEND</u>: Candy, gum, liquid soap, war related toys, anything w/camo, anything w/snakes or spiders, medication, vitamins, seeds, food or toothpaste.

Look for the tub and the list in the narthex in which we can collect the toys and ideas for collecting toys for various age groups. Let's try for a goal of 50 boxes!

We currently have a larger need for: Socks, pens, crayons, markers or highlighters, sharpeners (NO MORE PENCILS.), index cards, sticky notes, notebooks or coloring books and small books.

MISSIONS NOISY OFFERING

The month of June the "noisy" offering was \$69.40 and will be matched from Missions for Habitat For Humanity.

July Noisy Offering will be July 8th. for Camp Noah.

Camp Noah provides a safe, caring and fun environment where children whose communities have been impacted by disasters can get help processing the emotional aftermath of their disaster or trauma. Camp Noah uses a proven curriculum designed to build resiliency, restore hope, and change lives.

This year, Camp Noah will take place August 13-17 at St. Luke's Lutheran Church in Reading. About 30 children from Puerto Rico who were impacted by the 2017 hurricanes will spend five days with certified camp staff members who will facilitate all Camp Noah activities. In addition, local volunteers will help serve meals and snacks, provide transportation, safety, and a fun time for children. This is an opportunity for us as couriers of God's love and grace to contribute financially to a successful Camp Noah in Reading 2018.

Among the many ways Camp Noah will help these children are the following:

- *Every child receives 30 hours of therapeutic, play-focused, creative activities with a ratio of 3-4 children for every certified camp staff member. For example, the curriculum for Day 1 is designed to equip campers with several key resiliency skills: develop a sense of self-worth, understand oneself as unique and special, understand we are each an important part of a diverse community, and laughter, play and creativity.
- * Every child will receive a tied, fleece blanket to use and take home at the end of camp. The blankets are wonderful gifts, but more than that, they are a recovery tool for children, providing much needed comfort as they continue to process their disaster and/or trauma experience.
- * Every child will receive a Kids Kit to use and then take home at the end of camp. Kits include pencils, crayons, markers, Play Doh, etc. These kits often replace items that were damaged or lost in the disaster.
- * Card and board games will be used as ice-breakers and during free time.
- * Children's books of hope (in Spanish & English) will also be collected for the children to take home.
