July Noisy Offering Beneficiary

Habitat for Humanity of Montgomery and Delaware Counties partners with local residents to help them build or improve a place they can call home. Habitat homeowners help build their own homes alongside volunteers, and pay an affordable mortgage. Habitat also provides low cost home repairs, financial literacy and empowerment education, and revitalizes neighborhoods. With your support, families achieve the strength, stability and independence they need to build a better life for themselves.

Habitat welcomes volunteers and supporters from all backgrounds and also serves people in need of decent housing regardless of race, religion, age, gender, political views or any of the other distinctions that divide people.

In addition to the volunteer opportunities building and repairing homes that we're all familiar with, Habitat offers programs that can help families improve their day-to-day lives. For example,

<u>Almost Home</u> is a six-week program that focuses on overall behavior change and helps families set goals, learn skills and change financial behaviors. As a result of the program, families may become financially stable and thereby qualify for Habitat's Home Buying and Critical Home Repair programs.

Neighborhood Revitalization is a grass-roots level program that works with the people in the community to identify local assets and goals, stabilize neighborhoods, and improve residents' safety and quality of life. Through collaboration with residents, local government, the faith community (*us*), and community non-profits, the program responds to community aspirations by taking an overall look at needs and empowering residents and community partners to help their neighborhoods grow and thrive. Habitat works to improve an 11-block zone in Norristown comprising 320 households, and a six-block zone in Pottstown comprising 339 households.

<u>Habitat's Critical Home Repair</u> provides low-cost home repairs to address critical needs in a home that may threaten the health, safety, security, and/or accessibility. The program prioritizes low-income elderly, disabled, and veteran homeowners who are struggling to maintain their home. For example, this program enables homeowners over 65 to safely and affordably age in place rather than relocating to a significantly more expensive alternative such as assisted living or nursing home facilities.

FAMILY EASTER PRETZELS

1/8 cup hot water
1 package active dry yeast
1 ½ cups warm water
1/3 cup brown sugar
5 cups flour
extra flour
coarse kosher salt
1 Tbsp baking soda

Heat oven to 475. In a large bowl, mix the hot water and yeast until the yeast dissolves. Stir in the warm water and the brown sugar. Slowly add 5 cups of flour to the mixture, stirring constantly. Continue stirring until the mixture is smooth and does not stick to the sides of the bowl. Put the dough on a lightly floured board. Dip your hands in the extra flour. Knead the dough until it is stretchy and smooth. Push it down and away from you with the palms of your hands. Turn the dough as you work.

Grease two cookie sheets very well. Sprinkle each with coarse kosher salt. Set the sheets aside. Pinch off a piece of pretzel dough about the size of a golf ball and shape it into a pretzel.

Fill a frying pan with water. For each cup of water in the pan, add 1 tablespoon of baking soda. Bring the water to a gentle boil (a few bubbles). Use a spatula to lower each pretzel into the frying pan. Count very slowly to 30. Then lift the pretzel onto the greased and salted cookie sheet.

Repeat until all the dough is used.

Sprinkle kosher salt on top of the pretzels and bake them in the oven for 8 minutes or until the pretzels are golden.


