#### **CLEAN-UP BUCKETS AND HYGIENE KITS**





- 1. Donate any amount as you wish using a separate check with a note indicating dedication of the funds towards Clean-Up Buckets. A full bucket costs between \$55-\$75 to fill.
- 2. Pete Leneweaver and the Missions Team will be shopping for the best deals on particular items, using your donations and a limited amount of funds from the church's budget. If we purchase enough of some things, we will let everyone know that donations of that item are no longer needed.

Thank you so much. Our efforts will enable replenishment of inventories in advance of natural disaster season of floods, hurricanes and wildfires 
Each bucket needs the following items:

- 4 scouring pads
- 7 sponges, including 1 large
- 1 scrub brush
- 18 reusable, lightweight dry-cleaning towels (e.g. Handi wipes)
- 1 50 oz. or 2 25 oz. bottle(s) of liquid laundry detergent
- 1 16-28 oz. bottle of liquid disinfectant dish soap
- 1 12-16 oz. bottle of household cleaner that can be mixed with water (no spray bottles)
- 1 package of 48-50 clothespins
- Clothesline—(2) 50 ft. or (1) 100 ft.
- 5 dust masks
- 2 pairs heavy-duty, waterproof dishwashing gloves (latex-free, non-surgical)
- 1 pair work gloves, cotton with leather palm or all leather
- 24-28 heavy duty or contractor type 30-45-gallon trash bags on a roll and removed from carton
- 1 6-9 oz. bottle of non-aerosol insect repellent

Buckets will be filled on Monday, July 12th at 7:00, any help will be appreciated.

#### **MISSIONS UPDATE**

Thank you for your generous support of our UCC programs. We are able to send a check for \$325 to the Southeast PA Conference--\$200 for One Great Hour of Sharing and \$125 for Strengthen the Church.

And a big round of applause for contributions towards the Church World Service Clean-Up Buckets. \$975 was collected—enough to fill between 15-20 buckets, depending on our shopping prowess. The Missions Team is now busy shopping for the remaining items that are needed. We will fill the pallet full of 48 buckets at our next meeting. Pastor will deliver them to the warehouse in Maryland before he leaves for Ghana. Look for pictures in the August newsletter, on the church website and Facebook in the next few weeks.


