Trust

My sister Carol and her husband Ray visited with us the middle of June. Their first comment as they pulled into our drive was how green everything is. Unfortunately, they have not received the rain in North Carolina as we have had and their brown yards are a testimony. New plants that were just planted will most likely die. The opposite has been true for this part of Berks County. It has been perfect grass-growing weather and I have a newly planted yard to prove it!

It's the farmer in me that keeps me fixated on the weather, I just can't help myself. "Weather can make you or break you," as the saying goes. There is another saying that proclaims "you can talk about the weather but you can't do anything about it." Truer words were never spoken!

During times of heavy rains the name "Noah" and the idea of "ark construction" comes to mind. The story of Noah is perhaps the most well known of all Bible stories. You cannot go into a craft shop without seeing some reference to Noah, a dove, or the rainbow.

The one take away for me when I think of the story is "trust." The story of Noah is about a man doing something totally ridiculous simply because God asked him to. I know I am over simplifying the story, but when you boil the story down to its most minute particle, "trust" is the message.

But here, my beloved, is the bottom line; the dove will always, always, return with a branch of life in its beak and the rainbow will always, always be a sign of God's promise. It is where I place my trust. To coin a phrase of a friend Ernest Ephriam, The God I worship is not a liar! Amen and Amen

A Word About Worship

from the Worship Committee

The Paraments

The easy definition of parament, from Webster's Dictionary is simply, "an ornamental ecclesiastical hanging or vestment." Basically, in the sanctuary, it is the material that covers, and hangs in front of, the altar, the lectern and the pulpit. The most interesting part of the church's paraments is the various colors that are used during the church year and what those colors represent.

Color plays an important role in the life of God's worshiping people. Liturgical colors are those specific colors used for vestments and paraments in the sanctuary. Liturgical color complements the message of the seasons and occasions during the church year.

The use of colors to differentiate liturgical seasons became a common practice in the Western church in about the fourth century. At first, usages varied considerably but by the 12th century Pope Innocent III systematized the use of five colors: Violet, White, Black, Red and Green. The Lutheran and Anglican churches that emerged from the Reformation retained the traditional colors but they mostly disappeared from the worship services of the Reformed churches. During the 20th century, however, the ecumenical Liturgical Movement prompted the rediscovery of ancient Christian traditions which included the traditional colors of the western churches.

The third Sunday after Pentecost the parament covers were changed to green, which the UCC calls, "Time of the Church." Traditionally, the green paraments symbolize a time of growth in the Christian faith. It is the time for the renewal of vegetation and generally represents the promise of new life. It is a time that the congregation continues to learn and practice the teachings of Jesus.

The other colors of the paraments and church seasons will be the topic of future newsletter articles.
