Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Over the years I have enjoyed the writings of Brennan Manning. My favorite book of his is called The Ragamuffin Gospel. Brennan shares his experience of the grace of God in powerful ways in God's glorious creation. He writes, "We get so preoccupied with ourselves, the words we speak, the plans and projects we need to finish that we become immune to the glory of creation. We barely notice the cloud passing over the moon or the dewdrop clinging to the rose leaves. The ice on the pond comes and goes. The wild blackberries ripen and wither. We don't see the robin's nest outside the kitchen window. We grow complacent and lead practical lives. We miss the experience of awe, reverence and wonder." Manning goes on to say, "for the eyes of faith, every created thing manifests the grace and providence of God."

Can we really "become immune to the glory of creation?" Sad to say, the answer is yes. It is a danger we all face in our fast-paced and busy lives. If we are not careful, we will miss not just the glory of creation but the presence of the Creator found in it.

This summer I invite you to give yourselves the time and space to appreciate the wonders of creation... be it down at the shore, in the mountains, on a lake, in a garden or your backyard. Wherever you go, take in the wonder of it all and let your hearts be lifted in praise to the Maker of heaven and earth.


