PASTORS LETTER

As I write this letter, we are fast-approaching one of those transition times of the year, both in our daily lives and in the church. With the Memorial Day weekend on the horizon, most of us have begun to look forward to some much-anticipated "down time" that the summer season offers. In the Church, we will celebrate the Day of Pentecost and the gift of the Holy Spirit on June 4th, a celebration that most people see as the dramatic climax to the season of Easter. But is it really a climax, an ending, or is it actually a *new beginning*?

Pentecost means "the fiftieth day" in ancient Greek, a day that commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles fifty days after Christ's resurrection, and marks the birth of the Christian church. The color of the day is red, signifying the tongues of fire that rested over each of the Apostles' heads. Pentecost also derives from the Hebrew festival, Shavuot, "the feast of weeks," which was held fifty days after Passover and celebrated the first harvest of grain in the spring. The events described in *Acts* take place during this pilgrimage festival that attracted many Jews to Jerusalem.

In addition to receiving the gift of the Holy Spirit and marking the birth of the Christian church, the Pentecost event also helps us to conceptualize God as Trinity. As Christians, we have come to understand God in three ways: God as the Creator in nature; God as the Son, made manifest in the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus; and God as Spirit, living and active in the world today. The Spirit is evidence that the Christian faith does not limit itself to events that happened in the past, but also concerns itself with the present and the future. The Spirit is God's creative, animating presence in the church and in the body of Christ, God's people. Without the Spirit, we would not be able to carry out the mission and ministry of the Church that has been set before us.

That being said, it is important that we recognize that the significance of Pentecost does not end on that day, but continues through the long season after Pentecost, a season stretching from Trinity Sunday to the first Sunday of Advent; a season that is centered on the work of the Holy Spirit in our day-to-day lives as Christians. The season after Pentecost is reflected in the liturgical color of green, the color of *life and growth*. Through the gift of faith that comes only through the Holy Spirit, we have been given the abilities necessary to proclaim the gospel in our daily lives by service to our neighbors. For us, this means that this season of life and growth is the perfect time to concentrate on our Christian calls to evangelism, mission, stewardship, and compassionate care as we focus our efforts to share the gospel message and live out our faith. We've been entrusted with Jesus' mission in the world with lots of work to do and many opportunities available to us to do it! Do you remember that "seed" that I planted a few weeks ago? Have you been thinking about it? **NOW** might be the perfect time! Let's get busy!!


