REV. JOHN'S MUSINGS.

God is ever faithful to draw near to those ho draw near to Him. The Bible tells us, 'You will seek Me and find Me, when you seek Me with all your heart. I will be found by you,' declares the Lord: (Jeremiah 29:12-13). Melanie Shankle, author of "Everyday Holy: Finding God a Big God in the Little Moments" says the best way to find God in the little moments is to ask God to open your eyes to what God is doing all around you. "I try to start each day with just a simple, 'God, let me see you today' or 'God, show me where you can use me today," Shankle said. "You never know who will cross your path or where you can serve someone or help those in need. Sometimes it's as simple as a smile and a kind word. God made us to be His ambassadors here on earth." While there is no specific formula to draw near to God, there are specific things you can do daily that will help you recognize His presence. When we keep our eyes fixed on Jesus, God's presence can be seen even clearer. One way is to pray actively. Prayer helps us to find strength for today and hope for our future. We should actively pray and trust in its power to change our circumstances for good. Another great way to find God in the small moments is to have faith. Many of us are facing impossible situations where we need a breakthrough in our lives. Yet, most of us sit and wait for God to make it happen, and then we wonder why it is that we don't experience breakthrough as often or as fast as we'd like. What we need to know is that breakthrough is not something we sit around and wait for. Breakthrough is God waiting on us to respond in obedience to what He has already commanded and already promised. "God is always at work, even when you can't see Him," Shankle says. This is a wonderful reminder. Breakthrough happens when we take the first step against barriers in our life. Breakthrough happens when we say that we are going to trust that God is going to supernaturally do what is impossible. God does the breakthrough, but He's waiting for us to take that first step of faith. We have to believe in God's goodness, that God has already willed the breakthrough for our life.

Health & Beauty: Toothbrush, dental floss, band-aids, wipes, soap, comb/brush, manicure set, headbands, washcloth/towels. Articles for the Sunday bulletin are due in the church office by Wednesday. Newsletter deadline for the July Newsletter is June 21st and mailing is June 26th.




