ONE GREAT HOUR OF SHARING (OGHS)

St. Luke's will celebrate One Great Hour of Sharing during our service on Sunday, March 14th. To prepare ourselves, here's a Q&A about OGHS. Please give generously and use the special offering envelope that was mailed to your home. Thank you!

Q1: What is One Great Hour of Sharing®?

A1: It's part of Our Church's Wider Mission (OCWM), a special mission offering of the United Church of Christ that carries a message of love and hope to people in crisis. UCC works with international partners to provide sources of clean water, food, education, healthcare, small business microcredit, advocacy and resettlement for refugees and displaced persons, as well as emergency relief and rehabilitation. One Great Hour supports both domestic and global ministries for disaster preparedness and response.

Q2: Who participates in One Great Hour?

A1: Several Christian denominations including the American Baptist Church, Christian Church (Disciples of Christ), Church of the Brethren, UCC and Church World Service (CWS) work together to create common promotional materials, sharing ideas, costs and a commitment to service. However, each denomination receives and manages its respective offerings.

Q3: How does the UCC use its offering?

A3: 60% of the UCC offering supports international development initiatives including annual support for missionaries. Currently there are 2 supported missionaries and 1 global mission intern working in disaster relief, health care, education, sustainable agricultural development and refugee support. The offering also funds disaster preparedness and response and various disaster-related volunteer initiatives in the US.

Q4: How much is usually given to the UCC's One Great Hour of Sharing offering?

A4: In 2018 the OGHS offering was just under \$2 million. Nearly 65% of UCC congregations participate.

Q5: What percentage of OGHS donations are used for the missions?

A5: On average 95 cents of every dollar given to OGHS goes directly to mission programming. 5 cents goes towards interpretation materials. Any administration costs are paid for by OCWM national support. St. Luke's contributes every month to OCWM.

Dear St. Luke's United Church of Christ of Trappe,

Thank you so much for your very generous donation of \$104.00 (CK# 9718) on 11/12/2020.

We are now in the 9^{th} month since COVID-19 began to impact every part of our lives, many new people have turned to the pantry for help. In the first week of November alone, we had more than 110 families come to the pantry for food. Normally we serve around 250-300 families per month.

One of our clients called us on 12/1/2020. He said I have tried for the past 2 years to do everything to feed my family myself but I was laid off and have no more food in our home to do that. I let him of your generosity and that he should come in. He was one of our former clients who had to come back but held out until there was no other choice but to come back.

We've had clients in tears when they see how much food we are giving them. They say no please share that food with your other clients but we let them know that it is your generosity that makes it easy for us to give to them. They ask us to please thank those who have donated the food.

We had one family who was flooded out this year with 8 people in their household and another of our clients took them into their home so they would not be homeless making the household balloon to 18+ people living under one roof.

These are the faces & hearts of our clients. They care for each other like you are caring for them.

Words our not enough - all we can say is Thank you from the bottom of our hearts for all you do to help us keep going.
