1. Donate any amount as you wish using a separate check with a note indicating dedication of the funds towards Clean-Up Buckets. A full bucket costs between \$55-\$75 to fill.

2. Donate whatever items you wish using the list below. Please place these (new, not previously used) items in the Missions donation box by the Prayer Wall <u>no later than May 16th.</u>

3. Pete Leneweaver and the Missions Team will be shopping for the best deals on particular items, using your donations and a limited amount of funds from the church's budget. If we purchase enough of some things, we will let everyone know that donations of that item are no longer needed.

There's a full bucket display in the church Narthex as an examples. Take a list with you on your next shopping trip. Take advantage of sales and BOGOs (Buy 1 Get 1 free) specials. Or print out this newsletter page. Leave it in your car for the next time you're out running errands.

Thank you so much. Our efforts will enable replenishment of inventories in advance of natural disaster season of floods, hurricanes and wildfires. Let's get 'er done before Memorial Day and summer weather begins.

Each bucket needs the following items:

- 4 scouring pads
- 7 sponges, including 1 large
- 1 scrub brush
- 18 reusable, lightweight dry-cleaning towels (e.g. Handi wipes)
- 1 50 oz. or 2 25 oz. bottle(s) of liquid laundry detergent
- 1 16-28 oz. bottle of liquid disinfectant dish soap
- 1 12-16 oz. bottle of household cleaner that can be mixed with water (no spray bottles)
- 1 package of 48-50 clothespins
- Clothesline—2 50 ft. or 1 100 ft.
- 5 dust masks
- 2 pairs heavy-duty, waterproof dishwashing gloves (latex-free, non-surgical)
- 1 pair work gloves, cotton with leather palm or all leather
- 24-28 heavy duty or contractor type 30-45-gallon trash bags on a roll and removed from carton
- 1 6-9 oz. bottle of non-aerosol insect repellent


