NEWS FROM MISSIONS

Fall Festival Gratitude: Pastor and the Missions team would like to thank everyone who helped make our first Fall Festival a success. Whether you donated to the silent or live auctions, made a homemade goodie for the bake sale, volunteered to help on October 6th or simply came and enjoyed, we thank you for your support and participation. **We raised about \$4,500 (before limited expenses for supplies and advertising)!** 90% of that will go to St. Luke's general operating fund to help cover our deficit and 10% will come back to Missions, to pass onto several worthy organizations.

We are actively planning next year's event and welcome your suggestions for changes and improvements. Please feel free to forward your comments to any member of the Missions Team.

November Noisy Offering: On Sunday, November October 11th when we pass the spare change cans, we'll be asking for donations for the men being served by the **Fatherhood Empowerment Center**, a program of the Montgomery County Community Action Development Commission (CADCOM). This free program is dedicated to empowering, educating, supporting and challenging men to become stronger, more positive forces within their own families and communities. Through group meetings and individual counseling sessions, they strive to rekindle the values that allowed men and families to prosper for generations. This provides men the opportunity to communicate with other like-minded men who believe we all have a responsibility and desire to leave a positive legacy for our children.

Shoebox Update: It's almost time for our shoeboxes to make their way to some very deserving children around the world. In mid-November the Missions team will deliver our 50 boxes to Valley View Community Church in Audubon, which is the local collection site. They'll be combined with the efforts of other local churches and head for a national distribution center where thousands of volunteers serve annually to inspect and prepare the boxes for international shipping. Every hour work stops for a few minutes to pray for the children who receive the boxes. Thank you for your donations that make this evangelism and discipleship possible.

Upcoming Holiday Plans:

We'll be collecting additional food items for the Daily Bread as it gets closer to Thanksgiving. They are now feeding 500 families a month, a considerable increase from before. This year Missions will buy cases of canned goods on behalf of the church. We'd like to ask the congregation to focus instead on fresh produce and turkeys. Please stay tuned to the weekly bulletin and email for the deadline to drop off your items.

And we'll be doing Angel Tags again for the children who receive gifts from the Salvation Army. More information is likely to be available around Thanksgiving.




