REV. JOHN'S MUSINGS.

While the Book of Revelation is hard to understand for the common person, for one who has studied it over and over, I continue to find new insights. The passage of Revelation 21:5 "And the one who was seated on the throne said, "See, I am making all things new." This is from the NRSV translation. Without question, all things are new in perspective in my new setting and for our family. Slowly, we are getting settled and most importantly, establishing relationships and connections into the community. The one aspect no matter where we live, while the surroundings and culture may change, human nature doesn't. We all have 'old things' we tend to hold on to. Some people deal with addictions of some sort. Some people have 'old things' that fill their heart with fear. Those 'old things' are destructive habits that often brings death to our hopes and dreams. We all know of someone who have unhealed memories that causes sorrow and inflicts pain on our human soul. If you know someone who is going through these 'old things', have them practice this simple spiritual exercise. Whatever 'old things' that are a bondage to your past, read and affirm Revelation 21:3. Repeat as many times as necessary. When you begin to sense the reality of God's loving presence with you, hear God say, "I am making all things new!". This spiritual exercise may be helpful to you as a daily discipline until the awareness of God's deliverance and healing permeates your heart and calms your spirit. 

While Hurricane Irma may be about to wreak havoc on the homes and properties of Florida and surrounding states, the storm has also provided a reason for people to come together in meaningful ways.

One such scene unfolded in front of a TV news reporter who captured the moment on her phone.

Pam Brekke had traveled almost 30 miles to buy one of the 200 generators just shipped to the hardware store in Orlando, Florida yesterday in preparation for expected power outages.

Pam was next in line at the Lowe's store to purchase one of the gas-powered generators when she was told that the final unit went to the customer standing in from of her in line. She broke down in tears.

For medical reasons, her father relies on an oxygen pump that requires electrical power. Suddenly, a total stranger, Ramon Santiago, saw her crying, and walked over to insist that she take his.

She pulled the generous man into an embrace and cried even more, as Ramon soother her.

That's when WFTV's Nancy Alvarez pulled out her phone and captured the moment. The touching video spread on social media and Alvarez and Lowe's got together to plan a reward for Santiago. Today the store presented him with a new generator.

GOOD NEWS!!

Chocolate lovers, rejoice! There is now a fourth kind of chocolate to enjoy outside of dark, milk, and white.

Barry Callebaut, the world famous Switzerland-based chocolate manufacturer, has just announced the creation of "ruby chocolate": a pinkish treat that is made from the Ruby cocoa bean.

The delicious breakthrough was announced last week during a launch event in Shanghai. The release was arranged so that it occurred 80 years after the introduction of white chocolate.

The chocolatiers describe the ruby cocoa flavor as intense, smooth, and rich in berry flavors - but no fruity flavorings or chemicals are added for the unique taste.

"The fourth type in <u>chocolate</u> offers a totally new taste experience, which is not bitter, milky or sweet, but a tension between berry-fruitiness and luscious smoothness," <u>says</u> the company. "The bean has a specific set of attributes, which Barry Callebaut managed to unlock through an innovative process that took many years to develop."

The company said that they developed Ruby chocolate through extensive experimentation at their 28 R&D centers in Europe. Barry Callebaut representatives expect that the new candy will be a great success as it is gradually released around the world.

In an email Martha recently wrote:

... "I have a very special regard for your church and appreciate your support throughout the years. I am happy to hear that you now have a new full time minister and it is good to know more about him (and his family) . . . I have recently been given additional responsibilities at our University and so am busier than ever. Part of the reason for this is that my salary now comes from the University and not the Global Ministries. This is due to financial constraints of our UCC Global Ministries, and so it helps that the University pays my salary. I am still on the UCC Pension and health care, and I am still considered a missionary but the change has meant that the University expects more out of me in terms of administrative responsibilities and committee work in addition to teaching and being involved in chapel and other Christian activities, advising students, etc. Of course, I continue to be involved with the Bazaar Cafe Ministry and the hotline for foreign women as well, because besides teaching that is really my life work as a missionary . . .I do appreciate so deeply your Church's continued commitment to global mission and to my ministry in particular. . . ."
