#### A Word About Worship

Please Join Us to Celebrate World Wide Communion Sunday, October 1st at 9:00am in the Sanctuary.

The first Sunday in October is known as World Communion Sunday or World Wide Communion Sunday. It's a time when Christians around the world celebrate oneness in the body of Christ.

Did you know the idea originated in Pennsylvania? According to the Presbyterian Church USA website, World Communion Sunday began at Shadyside Presbyterian Church in Pittsburgh, PA in 1933. The Presbyterian Church eventually adopted the idea as a denominational practice in 1936. According to the website, "The concept spread very slowly at the start. People did not give it a whole lot of thought. It was during the Second World War that the spirit caught hold, because we were trying to hold the world together. World Wide Communion symbolized the effort to hold things together, in a spiritual sense. It emphasized that we are one in the Spirit and the Gospel of Jesus Christ."

Today, World Communion Sunday is celebrated around the globe. During the service, Christians in every culture receive communion to remember and re-affirm Christ as the Head of the Church. As we share communion on that day, we recognize that we are part of the whole body of believers. During that time, we gather with other denominations and congregations, whether they are gathered in grand cathedrals, mud huts, outside on a hilltop, in meetinghouse, storefronts or sanctuaries like ours we all celebrate Jesus and the life he has given us.
